This fund is administered by Publishing Scotland on behalf of Creative Scotland and provides grants to support publishers based outside the UK with the payment of translation fees to **translate Scottish writers**.

Priority is given to the translation of contemporary literature, including fiction, non-fiction, poetry, writing for children and graphic novels. Assessment criteria include the merit of the work to be translated, financial need of the publisher, the track record of publisher and translator, and the proposed marketing plan.

An expert panel meets twice a year to assess applications. Submission dates are also twice annually.
